ST. JOHN'S – VILMAR COUNCIL CAPSULE

Wednesday, Dec. 14, 2022

The St. John's Church council met for its regular meeting on Dec. 14. Diane Hummel gave devotions based on Psalm 46. Chairman Ron Salge called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

REPORTS

- Secretary: The secretary's report was read. There were no corrections or additions and the minutes would stand approved as read
- **Treasurer:** The treasurer's report was given by Margaret DeBower. A check from Iowa State Bank in the amount of \$200 was received and was to be used for supporting a local organization or family in need. After discussion about several possible places to donate, Warren Van Dyke made a motion to match the \$200 from Iowa State Bank and present a check for \$400 to Autumn Ackerman's family, from Greene, who recently lost their home and belongings to a fire. Barb Wagner seconded the motion. Motion carried. Margaret also visited with Jen Seehusen about the Wells of Inspiration project in Liberia. Jen is friends with Teta Ross, from Charles City, whose husband is a pastor in Liberia. Teta works in the U.S. and travels to Liberia to help the community with projects. Some current and former members of Vilmar are planning a mission trip to Liberia to help install five wells. The wells cost \$5,000 each, so funds are currently needed for their installation, as well as for the travel expenses for the mission trip. Vilmar will focus on the Wells of Inspiration project in February. Additional details will be coming, or you may talk to Jen if you want more information.
- **Chairman:** Ron Salge reported that he has been working to fill nominations for council positions opening up in 2023. Not all positions have been filled.
- Stewardship & Finance: No report available.
- Mission & Outreach: Barb Meyer reported that gifts for the North Butler family have been purchased and delivered, as well as the gifts for Bremwood. Some items have been purchased for Samaritan's Purse Project for 2023. The Christmas Eve and Christmas Day offering will be divided between radio stations Life 101.9, 88.9 Family Radio, and Christian Crusaders.
- Worship & Fellowship: Diane Hummel reported Pastor Zamzow will be conducting services on Dec. 18. Ken and Margaret DeBower will lead services on Christmas morning. Christmas Eve service will begin at 6:30 p.m. Christmas morning services will begin at 9 a.m. There will be no Sunday School on Christmas Day or New Year's Day.
- **Deacons:** Tyler Seehusen reported that more communion cards needed to be purchased. Monica Edeker reported that she already ordered the cards.
- **Trustees:** Evan Steere reported that rodent traps have been checked frequently. He also donated a spotlight that could be used for programs. Fire extinguishers will be checked by Hawkeye Fire and Safety. The defibrillator is in need of a new battery. The current battery will expire in four months. Batteries are currently unavailable through the distributor. A newer defibrillator model is available at a cost of \$1,600. Evan will continue to look for available battery, and Warren Van Dyke is looking into a possible grant for a new machine. The council also discussed another training course to use the defibrillator should be done in 2023.
