CONGREGATIONAL WORKSHOP

On Sunday, Jan. 31, members of Vilmar are encouraged to take part in a Congregational Workshop at Vilmar, led by Iowa Mission District Dean, Rev. Chris Staley. The intention of this workshop is for members of the congregation, along with the call committee, to begin to piece together Vilmar's Congregational Profile.

The workshop is estimated to take 4-5 hours. (The council will discuss the start time at their upcoming meeting, and details will be posted on the church's website and Facebook page.) This may seem like a big time commitment—and it is—but this will be a good investment and benefit for the future ministry at Vilmar. The information from the workshop will help to lay the groundwork for calling a pastor who can serve Vilmar for many years to come.

To begin this process, I ask that each of you take time to read the Bible passages noted in the box, and after reading each one, consider the following questions:

- What is God saying about His call to mission and ministry?
- What insights come from this passage regarding the ministry of the congregation/the community of disciples?
- What insights come from this passage regarding the ministry of the ordained pastor?
- How am I—how are we—being challenged by this passage to live and serve differently?
- In light of this passage, how might ministry at St. John's-Vilmar be renewed and restored?

You are encouraged to start thinking about these things, as well as items such as who we are here at Vilmar—our foundation, roots, and history, our family, our community, our rural location, the qualities needed in our next pastor, etc.

In light of the upcoming workshop, I would like to share the following with you all:

As I was organizing papers in the church office the other day, I found this poem buried within a folder marked “items to save.” I don’t know why it caught my eye, and I don’t know who put it in that folder, but I couldn’t help but think how fitting it is for all of us right now—not just with our church, but how true it is of our own lives and the world today. The poem reads as follows:

ANSWERS

*Answers to prayers,
Come in various ways,
Sometimes in minutes,
Sometimes in days.

And blessings they hold.*

*Answers to prayers,
Come in various forms,

As I was reading that, it reminded me of this verse in Galatians, “*Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.*” (Galatians 6:9)

Both seem like perfect, daily reminders for us. With whatever may be going on in our lives—job changes, health changes, stress, difficulties caring for loved ones—whatever the case may be, we must remain faithful and trust God’s timing. The same can be said of our world with the ongoing pandemic and social unrest we see today.

While it can be difficult to have patience with all these things, we should wait with hope and spend time getting to know God. As Diane Hummel shared with us during the Christmas service, God seeks out the quiet heart, and we need to seek to know Christ and worship Him. We can confidently build our relationship with Jesus, because we know that He will never stop loving us, He will always be with us, and He will give us strength for whatever comes our way.

The same can be said for our church as we move forward with the ministry and good news at St. John’s, and begin the search for our next pastor. We have to remember how incredibly blessed we are, and take time to daily thank and praise God for our faithful members and friends, and all the gifts He gives us. I have truly appreciated everyone’s devoted commitment and dedicated service to our church. We should be joyful and give thanks in all circumstances, as we work to live according to the Bible and teach it to others, because we know that with faith in Christ—and patience—God will provide for our needs according to his perfect timing.

With all that being said, I would again encourage you all to take some time to read the Bible passages and consider the questions posed on page 1. If anyone has an item that they would like mentioned during the workshop, please bring them with you on Sunday, Jan. 31. If you are not comfortable bringing the question or concern forward, or you cannot be at the meeting, feel free to get your information to any council member, and they will make sure each item is addressed during the workshop.

I look forward to the positive, uplifting discussion we will have at the workshop, as we discuss what God has planned for us in this place that we call home and family—St. John’s–Vilmar. Jesus Christ is the Good Shepherd. We must follow his lead and diligently seek him, as we seek to call the next shepherd of our congregation.

ST. JOHN'S – VILMAR COUNCIL CAPSULE

Wednesday, Dec. 9, 2020 | 7:30 p.m.

The St. John's–Vilmar church council met for their regular meeting on Dec. 9, 2020. Chairman Ron Salge called the meeting to order, and Rhonda Edeker gave a devotion.

REPORTS

- **Secretary:** Secretary report was given by Barb Wagner. There were no corrections or additions, and was approved as read.
- **Treasurer:** Treasurer's report was given by Brenda Boden. The general fund is currently at \$29,536.32 and \$3,695.66 has been given in donations/memorial gifts for the livestream system.
- **Chairman:** Ron Salge had no chairman report.
- **Stewardship & Finance:** No report.
- **Mission & Outreach:** Rhonda Edeker reported the following mission donations: Butler County Visions of Well-Being, \$200; Bremwood, \$670; Hope Ministries in Des Moines, \$250 to help with meals for the homeless; Appalachian Project in Kentucky, \$250. The December missions will be dispersed to the Gideons. The church also adopted a North Butler family for an extra Christmas Project. The Christmas Eve/Day service will be divided between the radio stations: Christian Crusaders, Life 101.9 and American Family Radio 88.9.
- **Worship & Fellowship:** Diane Hummel has prepared the Christmas Eve/Day worship. This service will be a virtual service and will be taped on Sunday, Dec. 13, 2020. The service will be aired on Christmas Eve, Thursday, Dec. 24 at 6:30 p.m. and Christmas Day, Friday, Dec. 25 at 9 a.m. These services will be available to view at any time. The organ and piano were also recently tuned.
- **Deacons:** No report.
- **Trustees:** No report.
- **Parish Ed.:** Monica reported that since in person worship and Sunday school has been suspended, she continues to send written correspondences with Sunday School children and families.
- **Director of Communications:** Monica prepared a report for the council to look at the cost analysis of Herald mailings. The council took no action at this time, and was tabled until next month. Monica will prepare another notice/survey to include in the January Herald.

OLD BUSINESS

- The new livestream system has been ordered from Butler County Computers and will be installed in the near future.
- Julie Eberline and Jean Morris have offered to shampoo the carpeting, as well as start a thorough cleaning of the parsonage.
- Ron Salge did fall spraying for dandelions on the lawns and south cemetery. Warren VanDyke, Kevin Edeker, and Jason Edeker continued parsonage grounds cleanup, trimming trees, and filling in holes in the lawn.

NEW BUSINESS

- A letter was read from Pastor Martin stating that the records of births, baptisms, confirmation, marriages and deaths were complete upon his leaving, and the responsibility of that record keeping was now given back to the church.
- The nominating committee for 2021 elections is Ron Salge, Kurt Roose, Wayne Dralle and Harlan Martzahn. The offices needed for the 2021 ballot include: one Deacon, Mission & Outreach chairperson, Parish Education chairperson, possibly one Trustee, one Bartels Retirement Community delegate, two delegates for the Iowa Mission District Convocation, and one delegate and one alternate for the NALC Convocation.
- The council discussed re-opening for in-person worship services. After discussion Jeff Seehusen made a motion to tentatively set a re-open date for in-person worship for Sunday, Jan. 3, 2021 pending any COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines changes, with the requirement of masks. Sunday School, Confirmation, Little Lutherans and any youth programs will continue to be suspended for the time being. Rhonda Edeker seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- A Pastoral Care Committee will be set up to offer in-home communion one time per month. Individuals interested in helping with this ministry may contact Rhonda Edeker.
- The 2021 church budget will be reviewed by Brenda Boden, Don Salge and Ron Salge, and brought to the council for approval in January.
- A letter was received from Cathedral Crafts Inc. concerning the resealing of the stained glass windows. Council tabled this action until spring of 2021.

CLOSING

The next council meeting will be held Wednesday, Jan. 13, 2021 at 7 p.m., in the Fellowship Hall. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
