LWR PERSONAL CARE KITS

Each kit must contain the following items:

- One light- or medium-weight bath towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars of soap (4-5 oz.) any brand, *in its original wrapping*
- One adult size toothbrush, in its original packaging
- One sturdy comb, remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers, remove packaging

Packing:

- Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business size envelope.
- Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn.
- Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

LWR FABRIC KITS

Each kit must contain the following items:

- Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blended fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:
 - 21/4 yards of 60" wide fabric, or
 - 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
 - 4 yards of 36" wide fabric
- •Two spools of matching or neutral colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each

Packing:

- Wrap thread and one piece of fabric inside second fabric piece.
- Tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon, or strip of fabric.
- Do no enclose the fabric kit or any contents in a plastic bag.

SOAP

Lutheran World Relief accepts new bars of any brand soap, in original wrapping. All bar sizes are accepted; however, bath-size (4-5 oz.) are highly preferred.

LWR BABY CARE KITS

Each kit must contain the following items:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long-or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (no feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a hat
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4-5 oz.) of gentle soap, in original wrapping, total of 9-10 oz. of soap, if bars are smaller
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Packing

- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted for new ones.
- Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.
- Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

TIPS

- Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the kit more useful as the baby grows.
- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from yarn or made from heavy double knit or fleece. Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front. *Visit LWR website for Baby Care Kits pattern recommendation*.
- Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling T-shirts. *Get diaper tip sheet from LWR website.*
- If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, include one knitted or crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket in the kit to provide maximum versatility.

LWR SCHOOL KITS

Each kit must contain the following items:

- Four 70 sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8x10.5; no loose leaf paper
- One 30-cm ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubberband
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no ink gel)
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2.5-inch eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14x17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Packing

- Place the rule between notebooks. Place all items neatly in the bag and draw the drawstrings together.
- Pack completed kits and like items together in boxes. Label contents in large block letter on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents.

Flood Buckets

- One 5-gallon bucket with lid
- One jug bleach (1/2 gallon or smaller)
- Two large trash bags (contractor 3 mil)
- One roll paper towels
- Two rags
- Comet or scouring cleanser
- Pine Sol or liquid cleaner
- · Scrub brush
- Gloves 1 pair of each (Size L, preferred)
 - rubber (reusable, i.e. Platex/dishwashing type)
 - leather
 - cotton

Health Care Kits

(pack in a 2-gallon plastic storage bag or tote bag

- 1 bath towel
- 1 wash cloth
- 1 shampoo (or 2 travel size)
- 1 bar of soap (or 2 travel size)
- 1 toothbrush
- 1 pack of floss
- 1 toothpaste (or 2 travel size)
- 1 comb
- 1 deodorant
- 1 nail clippers

Elementary School Kit

- 1 backpack or duffel bag
- 4 notebooks
- 4 pocket folders
- 1 blunt scissors
- 1 rule
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 4 pencils
- 2 pens
- 1 eraser
- 1 box or crayons, colored pencils, or markers

High School Kit

- 1 backpack or duffel bag
- 4 notebooks
- 4 pocket folders
- 4 pencils (regular or mechanical)
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 eraser
- 4 pens

Kitchen Kits

(Pack kits in a 2-gallon plastic storage bag or drawstring backpack)

- 1 cookbook
- Dish cloths
- Dish towels
- Hot pad
- Spatula
- Measuring cups
- Measuring spoons
- Kitchen item of choice (mini cutting board, peeler, tongs, etc.)
- Storage container
- Garbage bags (a few, mixed sizes)
