Lent Information and Schedule

During Lent we will be using the Sola Lenten Drama, "Fulfilled in Him"

Blessed be the LORD, the God of Israel, who with his hand has fulfilled what he promised with his mouth..." (1 Kings 8:15)

Jesus began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."(Luke 4:21)

One of the most repeated refrains in the New Testament has the assertion that all of Scripture is fulfilled in Jesus Christ himself. He used the Old Testament to teach the disciples about himself, telling them that the promise of the biblical ancestors and prophets pointed forward to him. (Luke 24:44)

During the season of Lent, we will focus on the events leading up to Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. In the ancient words of Scripture Christ's sacrificial giving of himself for our sake is realized. In our Lenten drama series, we focus on five pairs of characters. Each pair includes one character from the Old Testament and one from the New Testament. Each demonstrating in their witness the fulfillment of God's promise.

Each week we will meet two Biblical characters reflecting on his or her faith through monologues. Through what is shared in the paring of these characters, we have an opportunity to examine how Christ is the key to Scripture – "the founder and perfecter of our faith." (Hebrews 12:2)

Various readers from the congregation will be helpful to make these dialogues more interesting for your listening. Lectors for the scripture passages assigned will be helpful, as well. Pastor will have copies of each monologue and the scripture for you.

The Mid-week practice of Lenten worship offers us all an opportunity to hear again and anew the many truths of God's words and to help us deepen our faith journey with Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. I hope we can each carve out time to receive Christ in the many services at church and in your own homes.
