Wednesday, Feb. 8, 2023

The St. John's Church Council met for its regular meeting on Feb. 8. Diane Hummel gave devotions based on Matthew 5. After the council reviewed the agenda, Monica Edeker called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

The meeting opened with nominations for a new church council chairman. After much discussion about the position and the importance of communication and assistance from everyone serving on the council, Don Salge accepted the nomination for chairman, with Margaret DeBower seconding it. The motion carried unanimously.

REPORTS

- **Secretary:** The report was read by Monica Edeker, and approved as presented. We are continuing to wait for the offering envelopes.
- Treasurer: The report was read by Margaret DeBower, and approved as presented.
- Stewardship & Finance: A motion was made by Dale Janssen to make two CDs at Lincoln Savings Bank (LSB). One for \$10,000 at 12 months and one for \$10,000 at 6 months. Margaret DeBower and Monica Edeker are to be the signers on both CDs. The funds will be dispersed from account 3405051. Seconded by Ron Taylor. Motion carried unanimously. Margaret and Monica will need to go to LSB together to complete the new CDs per LSB banker, Ashley Coake.
- Mission & Outreach: No report.
- Worship & Fellowship: Diane Hummel reported she has a Lenten series ready for the Wednesday night services, and will need volunteers to read and lead the services each week.
- **Deacons:** None.
- **Trustees:** The trustees will install the new defibrillator, put up the curtains in the Sunday School rooms, replace some trim in the back stairwell, and replace lights in the outdoor cross.
- Parish Ed.: No report.
- **Director of Communications:** Monica will continue to use up the variety of colored and different sized paper in the office for our bulletins and Heralds.

Mission and Outreach

Lent Offering: The 2023 Lent offering will be sent to Lutheran World Relief (LWR) for their assistance with the earthquake victims in Turkey. LWR is currently working to help establish temporary shelters and provide critically needed care and supplies for families who lost their homes.

March Mission: During March, our mission and outreach project will be the NALC Disaster Response Flood Buckets. Buckets are available in the narthex. Items needed to fill each include:

- 1 jug bleach (1/2 gallon or smaller)
- 2 large trash bags
- 1 roll paper towels
- 2 rags
- Comet or scouring cleanser
- Pine Sol or liquid cleaner
- Scrub brush
- Gloves: 1 pair each of rubber, leather, and cotton gloves (all size large, preferably)

The filled buckets are due to the church by Sunday, April 2.

Disaster Response Kits: The NALC Disaster Response also collects items for Health Care Kits, Kitchen Kits, School Kits, Bibles, Prayer Books, Quilts, Blankets, and other miscellaneous items. More details about each kit have been posted on the bulletin board in the narthex. Vilmar Women's Fellowship will be collecting any of these items throughout the year, so any items for these projects may be brought to the church at any time.

Wells of Inspiration: Thank you to everyone who has donated to the Liberia, Africa – Wells of Inspiration mission in February, and for those who helped and supported the soup fundraiser and bake sale. With everyone's generosity, the project has already raised a considerable amount of money that will be used to build the wells and the learning center, as well as provide rice and supplies for the villagers. Please continue to pray for this mission, as Clint and Amy Seehusen, Marc and Jennifer Seehusen, and Teta Ross, prepare for their trip to Liberia this month to continue sharing God's Word and building relationships with the people there.

Lenten Season

The idea of fasting for Lenten season goes back to the early church. It wasn't fish they avoided; that was a much later idea from the Roman Church. The early church fasted based on local customs of the regional bishop. Even then there was much debate among the bishops about how much to fast, how long to fast, what days were to be fast days.

Today, fasting has gone out of vogue. We look at the Roman idea and scoff at it and then scoff at the whole concept. But there are things we can more profitably fast from than food. How about a fast of known bad behavior? We all know our own bad habits better than anyone else, except our spouses, of course. Think of one or two and determine to identity it when you see it coming in to play, and fast from it. Easier said than done, but all fasting is that way.

Then there are known sins. We love them, and we hold fast to them. They are not just habits; they are direct violations of God's Word. In a survey taken at a Christian men's convention, over fifty percent of men in church leadership admitted to viewing pornography on at least a weekly basis.

That was an extreme example, but it reflects that sinful practices are common in our churches. Using the Lord's Name in vain is one, and it is a direct violation of one of the Ten Commandments. If we examine the Ten Commandments, do we find other things that are part of our daily life, or weekly life? How about remembering the Sabbath and keeping it holy? I would love to go to church, people say, but there is jut too much to do on Sundays. Excuses don't negate sin's condemnation.

And finally, there are sins of omission. These are not Ten Commandment sins, but they are direct violations (sins) regarding other commands in Scripture. When God says, "Do this" it is a sin not to do it. Those are sins of omission and they are the poisons of Satan to undermine our spiritual life and health. Our weekly Lenten services will concentrate on these "Omissions". We can learn to fast from them, not just during Lent, but all year long.
