Congregational Workshop Summary

hank you to everyone who participated in the Congregational Workshop on Sunday, Feb. 28. There were 35 people in attendance, and everyone's thoughts, insights, concerns, and conversation were appreciated, as the church began to lay the groundwork of their Congregational Profile.

The afternoon started with a prayer and introduction from Iowa Mission District Dean Pastor Chris Staley. The members broke into small groups for Bible study on the following passages: 1 John 4:1-7, Matthew 29:17-20, John 10:7-18, John 21:15-29, John 20:20-23, Acts 6:1-7, Galatians 1:11-17, Galatians 5:13-25, and Ephesians 4:11-16. Each group discussed and then shared with the larger group the following: 1. What is God saying about His call to mission and ministry? 2. What insights come from this passage regarding the ministry of the congregation/the community of disciples? 3. What insights come from the passage regarding the ministry of the ordained pastor? 4. How am I – how are we – being challenged by this passage to live and serve differently? and 6. In light of this passage, how might ministry in our congregation be renewed and restored? Pastor Staley also provided guidance throughout the workshop.

The afternoon continued with discussion about the ministry at Vilmar and how the congregation is built on close-knit relationships with a family-structure, and pulls together for one another. There was discussion about the current reality of the church's finances, property, and expectations for the future ministry. The group shared numerous uplifting projects of outreach and hope, and other traditions the church already undertakes. Additional thoughts, ideas, programs, and activities were brought forward and discussed. The conversation continued by looking at the positive work from previous pastors' calls, as well as the struggles that the congregation had with them.

The conversation evolved and dug deep into both those positive and negative experiences, to help understand exactly the kind of qualities and traits the next pastor must possess to be a good, valuable, and productive fit at Vilmar.

Call Committee Notes & Updates

- Following the Congregational Workshop, on Sunday, Feb. 28, the Call Committee met briefly to discuss their next steps. Diane Hummel was elected chairman of the committee. The group will meet Tuesday, March 2 at 7 p.m. to begin work on the Congregational Profile, as was advised by Rev. Chris Staley. Members present included Ron Salge, Diane Hummel, Julie Eberline, Monica Edeker, Marc Seehusen, and Barb Wagner.
- The Call Committee met Tuesday, March 2 at 7 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Call Committee Chairman, Diane Hummel opened the meeting with prayer and devotions based on Ephesians 3. The NALC Call Process Manual was given to each member. The committee worked through the Congregational Profile questions, and spent time discussing each of the answers. Monica will begin creating a profile video about the church to accompany the written profile. Diane will contact Rev. David Wendel to set up a conference call with him, as is required in the call process manual. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Members present included Ron Salge, Diane Hummel, Doug Schueler, Monica Edeker, Marc Seehusen, and Barb Wagner.
- The Call Committee met on Thursday, March 18 at 6:30 p.m. The meeting opened with devotions and prayer led by Call Committee Chairman, Diane Hummel. The group finalized Vilmar's Congregational Profile and previewed the profile video. At 7 p.m., the group met with Pastor David Wendel of the NALC via conference call. Pastor Wendel explained the call process, and answered questions. The members then spent some time discussing the information and different options for the church. Members present included: Diane Hummel, Barb Wanger, Ron Salge, Julie Eberline, and Monica Edeker.
- Vilmar's completed profile questionnaire and video were submitted to Pastor Wendel at the NALC office and Pastor Chris Staley, Dean of the Iowa Mission District on Friday, March 19. The information was uploaded to the NALC's website on Tuesday, March 23, and can be accessed at https://thenalc.org/call-process/

The information will be sent out to all NALC pastors following Easter, when the monthly pastoral vacancy list is sent. The video is available to watch on YouTube, and all the information is available on Vilmar's website as well.

Pastor Staley advised that the congregation carefully build their profile to reflect, "Who we are, what we want, and how we live." The afternoon continued with conversation about the next steps forward for the church. There was discussion about what needs to be done before the next pastor is called to serve, as well as what is standard procedure in the process.

The day concluded with the group compiling a list of priorities for the next shepherd of Vilmar. Collectively, the group came up with the following: visitation/regular contact, good sermons (preach the Gospel), community-minded, can relate to all ages, teach confirmation, good steward of the property, communion frequency, provide counseling/guid-

ance, appreciates tradition, part of the family, growing the flock, singer/musician, tech savvy, good with administration, committed, and supportive/involved with the youth. Each member present then chose their top five priorities, and the lists were given to the call committee to look through to begin to compile the results.

The day ended with the singing of the doxology and a prayer by Pastor Chris Staley. Thanks to everyone who was able to be a part of this good investment for the future ministry at Vilmar. The church is looking forward to calling a pastor who can serve the needs of our Vilmar Family for many years to come.

ST. JOHN'S - VILMAR COUNCIL CAPSULE

Wednesday, March 10, 2021

The St. John's Church Council met for its regular meeting on March 10, 2021 immediately following the evening Lenten Service. Chairman Ron Salge called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m. Secretary Barb Wagner gave the minutes of the February council meeting. There were no corrections or additions and the minutes stood approved as read. Due to the absence of Treasurer Brenda Boden no financial report was given.

REPORTS

- Chairman: No report by the chairman was given.
- Stewardship & Finance: No report.
- Mission & Outreach: Barb Meyer read a thank you from Hope Ministries from Des Moines, our March mission partner. Hope provides food, clothing, shelter, and life recovery programs for men, women, and children out of seven ministry centers around the Des Moines area. The Lenten offerings will be given to Lutheran World Relief. Barb is welcoming any suggestions for special projects for future mission offerings.
- Worship & Fellowship: Diane Hummel reported that David Craig will be conducting services on Sunday morning and Lenten services through Easter, with the exception of Good Friday, which will be a lay service. Easter morning service will be held at 9 a.m. only. There will not be an Easter breakfast. Diane also reported that the Call Committee will be meeting with Rev. David Wendel on March 18 about the next step(s) of the call process.
- **Deacons:** The deacons will put an informational sheet on the bulletin board behind the pulpit with general instructions and guidelines for setting up for Holy Communion.
- **Trustees:** No report.
- **Parish Ed.:** Julie Eberline reported that Sunday School classes resumed on Sunday, March 7. Students and teachers were excited to be back to learning and being together. Social distancing will continue in the classrooms.

Director of Communications

- Monica Edeker has put together a Congregational Profile video, which was advised by the Iowa Mission District Dean, Rev. Chris Staley. The video will be sent to the NALC website and will be available for viewing after March 18. This video gives a short overview of information and history of Vilmar, including photographs of the church, parsonage and church property.
- The council reviewed COVID-19 guidelines that have been in place. Barb Wagner made a motion that masks are now be RECOMMENDED and not required during the worship services/events on the premises and that social distancing is still recommended while attending services/events on the church grounds. Motion was seconded by Jason Edeker. Council approved. Holy Communion will be processional; hand sanitizer will be available; the offering plate will remain in the back of the church and will not be passed. Coffee and fellowship after the worship service is tentatively set to resume on Sunday, April 11. Worshipers are asked to respect each other's choice to wear/not wear masks.

- Monica gave a report on the Herald mailings. This past month, 97 Heralds were emailed, 60 were printed and mailed and 20 were picked at the church. A mailbox has been put in place in the narthex for those choosing to pick up the Herald. Portals of Prayer are also available. The bulk mailing permit account will be closed and the remaining \$46 on account will be refunded.
- Palm branches for Palm Sunday have been ordered.
- The renewal for Portal of Prayer booklets will be renewed in August. At that time the number of booklets ordered will reviewed and changed if needed.
- David Voigts asked that the Voigts Family Reunion be removed from the 2021 calendar. He has requested the reservation date of June 12, 2022 for their next family reunion in the Fellowship Hall.
- Information was received concerning putting together a new Vilmar Pictorial Directory. The council felt there was no need for a new directory at this time.
- A thank you was read from Susanne Cooper expressing their families gratitude for prayers offered on behalf of their sons COVID recovery and continuing prayers for her sister, Brenda Schmadede, who is going through cancer treatments.
- A letter was received from the organ tuner requesting an updated contract for yearly services. He has asked to raise contract price to \$580/year from the current \$400. It was decided more information was needed as to what services will be provided under the new contract. Diane will look into getting that additional information. Council tabled discussion to April meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

• The new sound system is in place and seems to be working well. Those who have been listening online have given positive feedback.

NEW BUSINESS

- Dust control: Contracts were received from AP Fertilizer for \$420 (400'x18' 2x/year); Niemeyer for \$0.65/ft. (547' was applied in 2020). Since contracts are not due until later April, council tabled discussion and a decision will be made at the April meeting.
- Church cleanup: A date for church grounds cleanup will be determined at April meeting.

The next regular council meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, April 13, 2021 at 7:30 p.m.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
