# Of Sheep and Fish

ote: Rev. David Craig is scheduled to lead the Sunday worship services at St. John's - Vilmar through July, and offered to provide newsletter articles each month. The following is his message for May.

Jesus said to His disciples, "I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). Jesus also said to Peter, "Tend My sheep." (John 21:16) We have

two distinct commands in these verses. First is to evangelize, to become "fishers of men." Second is to feed and care for the sheep of Christ's flock. Who is entrusted with these commandments? Everyone who is a Christian is commissioned to do so.

How do these directions apply to us? Whenever we read our Bibles, we must ask ourselves that simple question, "How does this apply to me?" Biblically speaking, fish are lost souls, those who don't know Christ as Savior. Those who are sheep are those who have believed in Christ and now need

tending and feeding to make them strong and healthy. The people of Christ's church are dually commanded to both evangelize and feed.

Statistics show a plummeting of the number of people who identify themselves as Christians and of that number those who act upon that profession by reading God's Word and faithfully attending to the preaching of the Word. America has shifted to a secular nation where a minority of people profess Christ as Savior and many of those who do fail to demonstrate any faith in Him.

What does this mean for the local church? It means simply that we must realize that every one of our neighbors, friends, and relatives who do not profess Christ as Savior are doomed to everlasting hell. We need to become serious about the command to be fishers of men. We need to witness to others about the grace of God and the only means of salvation, faith in Jesus Christ.

### ST. JOHN'S - VILMAR COUNCIL CAPSULE

Wednesday, April 14, 2021

The St. John's Church council met for its regular meeting on April 14, 2021 at 7:30 p.m. Diane Hummel opened the meeting with devotions. Chairman, Ron Salge, called the meeting to order.

#### **REPORTS**

- **Secretary:** Secretary, Barb Wagner, gave the minutes of the March council meeting. There were no additions or corrections noted and would stand approved as read.
- **Treasurer:** Brenda Boden gave a review of the financial report. Currently the operating balance is \$34,516.18. A CD at Lincoln Savings Bank, designated for stained glass window repair, will mature on April 19, 2021. Council decided to renew the \$4,019.85 CD at the best rate on the renewal date.
- Chairman: Nothing to report.
- Stewardship & Finance: Nothing to report.
- Mission & Outreach: Barb Meyer reported that a \$200 donation was designated and sent to the University of Iowa Children's Hospital in Iowa City. February mission donations were sent to World Vision for \$495. March mission funds were sent to Hope Ministries in Des Moines for \$252. Lenten offering was sent to Lutheran World Relief for \$1,374. A thank you was read from Little Lambs Day Care thanking St. John's for their continued support with needed supplies and monetary donations. During the month of April, Vilmar's Mission and Outreach Team will be collecting donations to be put toward the yearly North Butler Scholarship Program. Each year a one- time \$500 scholarship is given to one girl and one boy from the graduating class. The scholarships for 2021 will be awarded on May 19 and will be presented by board chairman, Ron Salge. The annual Butler County Relay For Life will be held at the Butler County Fairgrounds on July 9. In conjunction with Relay For Life, June 6, 2021 has been designated as HOPE Sunday at Vilmar. Individuals will be able to purchase and decorate luminaries in memory or in honor of loved ones who have experienced cancer. More information will become available on purchasing luminaries in the near future.
- Worship & Fellowship: The council discussed Pastor David Craig's job description while serving Vilmar as a supply pastor. After discussions, Brenda Boden made a motion that Pastor Craig be hired for a three month increment for June, July, and August. During this time Pastor Craig will visit homebound members of St. John's. Warren VanDyke seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ron Salge and Diane Hummel will visit with Pastor Craig about his responsibilities and provide a list of members who he may wish to contact for visitation/communion. Pastor Craig will be paid \$150/week plus mileage.
- **Deacons:** Nothing to report.
- **Trustees:** A leaking water valve was replaced in the basement. A leak in the downstairs bathroom shower will be looked into. A report from the DNR was read, and any issues will be addressed. Warren will contact Jensens to put rock around the church on the parking area and driveways. Kurt Menken offered his services to paint and caulk the stained glass windows.

- Parish Ed.: Julie Eberline reported that Parish Education recently presented Bibles to Finn Seehusen and Alivia Ufford during a recent worship service. The Parish Ed balance is \$867.91.
- **Director of Communications:** A yearly, state inspection was done on the elevator. There were no concerns with the elevator and passed inspection. Herald reports are now being either mailed out, emailed or picked up at the church. This new distribution seems to be going well. Virtual services continue to be offered online each week. Comments continue to be positive and appreciated. Children's sermons during worship were discontinued due to COVID-19 restrictions. At this time council decided that children's sermons could now resume.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

• Sound System: The new video system is now in place and seems to be working well. Those who have been listening online have given positive feedback. It has been brought to council's attention that some individuals have noticed an echo during in person worship. The issue will be looked into.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Dust Control: A contract for dust control application was given to Niemeyer. The dust control application will be applied two times a year for 547'.
- Church Cleanup: A cleanup day for church and parsonage grounds is still to be determined.
- A letter requesting sponsorship of a PreK-6th grade Little League ball team was received from organizers of the program. Council discussed and declined to do a sponsorship.

The next council meeting will be held Wednesday, May 12, 2021, at 7:30 p.m.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

#### PASTOR'S NOTE FROM PAGE 1

Second, we need to be more diligent in tending God's flock. When sheep go astray, we can't ignore their absence from the flock. We need to go out into the hills and the valleys and bring them back into the fold. We also need to hold sheep accountable for being part of the flock. Shepherds will break one leg of a sheep that frequently strays and then carry it on his shoulders until the break heals. Then the sheep is again allowed to join the flock, but if it continues to stray it becomes the shepherd's supper. It is no longer part of the flock.

We cannot just sit and lament about the decline of interest in Christ among people in general and the ongoing absence of church members. We have a commission from Christ to be both fishers and shepherds. Our interest in men's souls must become active to change things and not be resigned to say, "That's the way it is." We must act on our biblical directive, not for us alone, but for all who face eternal consequences for their disinterest in Christ.

### **NALC Disaster Response**

The NALC Disaster Response truck will be in Iowa in late June, and we are collecting items for this mission. The following are items that are needed. Please bring any items to the church and leave them in basement on the carpeted area. Mission and Outreach volunteers we will pack the items and arrange for the delivery to the NALC disaster response truck in June.

Flood Buckets: We have 15 flood buckets available to fill at the church. Each bucket should include: 1 jug bleach; 2 large trash bags; 1 roll paper towels; Comet or scouring cleanser; Pine Sol or liquid cleaner; scrub brush; gloves, 1 pair rubber gloves; 1 pair leather gloves; 1 pair cotton gloves (all size L) High School Kit: 1 backpack or duffle bag; 4 notebooks; 4 pocket folders; 4 pencils; 1 pencil sharpener; 1 eraser; 4 pens; 1 high school calculator

**Elementary School Kit:** 1 backpack or duffle bag; 4 notebooks; 4 pocket folders; 1 blunt scissors; 1 ruler; 1 pencil sharpener; 4 pencils; 2 pens; 1 eraser; 1 box of crayons

Health Care Kit: 1 bath towel; 1 washcloth; 1 shampoo (regular size or 2 travel size); 1 bar of soap (regular size or 2 travel size); 1 toothbrush; 1 pack of floss; 1 toothpaste (2 if travel size); 1 comb; 1 deodorant; 1 nail clippers (Pack items in 2-gallon Ziplock bag or tote bag)

**Miscellaneous:** Bibles (new or slightly used); prayer books; quilts and blankets; gift cards to Home Depot, Lowes, or Walmart; masks; baby diapers (disposable, assorted sizes); mops, booms, dustpans, rakes, shovels, etc.
