Wednesday, May 4, 2022

The St. John's Church Council met for its regular meeting on Wednesday, May 4, 2022. Chairman Ron Salge called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. A devotion based on Psalm 119 was read by Diane Hummel.

REPORTS

- Secretary: The secretary's report was read by Barb Wagner and approved.
- Treasurer: Margaret DeBower gave the treasurer's report, and it was approved as read.
- Chairman: No report.
- Stewardship & Finance: No report.
- Mission & Outreach: Each year St. John's awards two \$500 scholarships to one boy and one girl graduating from North Butler. After reviewing many worthy applicants the Mission and Outreach Team chose Lucas Martzahn and Ellah Schell as the 2022 recipients. The scholarships certificates will be awarded at the Awards Program on May 18.
- Worship & Fellowship: No report.
- **Deacons:** No report.
- **Trustees:** Warren VanDyke received quotes for cleaning the carpet in the church and for rewaxing the basement floor. A motion was made by Margaret DeBower and seconded by Diane Hummel to have the church carpets cleaned by Heaven's Best at a cost of \$738.65. Motion carried. Warren also noted that the educational roof needs sealing. Warren will find help to reseal the roof. The north sidewalk concrete needs to be replaced and will be done by trustees and available help. Evan and Meredith Steere fixed the siding on the educational unit, and a new light was put in at the ed. unit entrance.
- Parish Ed.: May 22 will be the last day of Sunday school for the summer break. A special thank you to students and parents for faithful attendance and commitment and teachers and staff for your faithfulness is teaching the youth.
- Director of Communications: Monica Edeker has posted a sign-up sheet for mowing this summer. If you can help in any way, please sign up. Dust control has been put on hold until next month. Several dates to keep in mind: May 15 the family of Brenda Schmadeke will host lunch following the service in honor of Brenda's birthday. May 21 is the wedding of Isabella Seehusen and Wyatt Ragsdale led by Mission District Dean Chris Staley. On May 22 high school and college graduates will be honored. Names of honorees can be given to Monica for recognition in the bulletin. Memorial Day, May 30 there will be a short program at the south Vilmar cemetery conducted by Allison Honor Guard. On Sunday June 12, Vilmar will have a Sunday of Hope Service honoring cancer survivors and remembering those who have died from cancer. Luminary bags may be purchased from Margaret DeBower of Jennifer Seehusen for \$10 each, and will be displayed in the sanctuary on that Sunday of Hope. The Voigts family has reserved the fellowship hall for the Voigts Reunion on June 12.
