NALC Convocation Report

e had the privilege to represent Vilmar at the biannual National Convocation in Oklahoma City from Aug. 9-11. It was a packed three days full of worship, Bible studies, speakers and workshops. There were 224 lay delegates, 245 clergy and 145 visitors in attendance.

The NALC is growing in numbers. Forty six congregations have been added since the 2021 Convocation for a current total of 490. About 45 percent of the congregations were represented.

The NALS (seminary) reported that there are 61 students preparing for the ministry. There are 12 newly ordained and 43 previously ordained pastors that have joined the NALC.

Bishop Dan Selbo was reelected for 4 more years. The other item of discussion and voted on was the support of Lutheran World Relief. LWR itself doesn't pay for abortions, but they belong to a group of organizations where some of them do support abortion. It was voted to not give any financial support to them and find another organization to support.

The NALC Disaster Response emptied five of their 15 warehouses since the devastating April tornadoes. Of the victims helped 95 percent have no church family. This is a great outreach to show God's love to those in need.

NALC now has 17 Global workers that they support in many countries and here at home. Those

in the USA serve many refugee communities.

Dr. David Luy from the North American Lutheran Seminary lead a Bible study at the beginning of each day's session. Highlights from these are summed up in the following statements. "We can not manipulate God's mission and word, but we can participate in it." "Discipleship is not something we do. It is who we are." "God doesn't call us to be successful. He calls us to be faithful."

We attended several workshops.

"Sexual Slavery-call it what it is" highlighted the growing dangers of human trafficking. It is everywhere and is growing immensely over the internet. The internet is used to lure victims by befriending them and then it goes on from there.

"Every Congregation Renewing" focused on how to strengthen aging congregations and to help them grow.

"How Congregations Can Address the Range of Life Issues" A Committee is developing a Bible study series to address life issues from conception to end of life and all circumstances in between. Topics will cover the value of human life, we are all adopted, who is our neighbor, end of life issues and suffering and compassion.

We will give a report after worship service in the near future. If you have any questions, please talk to either of us.
