ST. JOHN'S – VILMAR COUNCIL CAPSULE Wednesday, Aug. 10, 2022

The St. John's Church Council met for its regular meeting on Aug. 10, 2022. Chairman Ron Salge called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Diane Hummel gave devotions and prayer.

REPORTS

- Secretary: The secretary's report was not available.
- **Treasurer:** Margaret DeBower gave the treasurer's report and was approved as read. Margaret discussed the offering and dues for the Iowa Mission District Convocation. Warren VanDyke made a motion to give a \$100 offering and take \$1,000 from the general fund to be given for dues. Don Salge seconded the motion. Motion carried. A total of \$764.82 was given to the Special Hope Network mission project.
- Chairman: None.
- Stewardship & Finance: None.
- Mission & Outreach: The August mission emphasis is the Allison and Greene Food Banks. A thank you was read from Ellah Schell expressing her appreciation for being selected as one of the recipients of the NB scholarship from St. John's. A Butterfly Release and Remember event will be held Sunday, Sept. 11 in Waterloo.
- Worship & Fellowship: Diane Hummel gave information on pulpit supply. Several members have expressed that the song "Go Now In Peace" be put back into the service. Council agreed to have the song remain in the order of worship. An outdoor service will be held on Aug. 14 at the Wilder Park Chapel. A potluck will be held at the lodge. In case of inclement weather the church service will be held in the lodge also.

- **Trustees:** The fuel oil contract with Allison Propane will be renewed for \$600 for 3,000 gallon. Evan reported that he had fixed door closures that had been damaged with wind, checked rodent control boxes, and pulled volunteer trees. He will be getting an estimate for power washing the parsonage.

- Director of Communications: No report due to Monica's absence.

- Ron continues to be in contact with Dan Olson in regards to sound system. It is Dan's recommendation that we change to different microphones. Two cordless microphones will be purchased as well as a new headset for the pastor.

Iowa Mission District Convocation

The Iowa Mission District met for the annual convocation on Saturday, Aug. 27 at Zion Lutheran Church, Ruthven. The day began with a worship service. Mission District Dean, Pastor Christopher Staley convened the convocation, and served as assisting minister for worship. Rev. Dr. Eric Riesen, President of the North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS) was the preacher for the day, Pastor Gary Burkhalter was presider, and lay minister Eric Patten was lector.

Pastor Riesen gave the keynote address and shared his hopes for the NALS, stressing the current shortage of pastors across all denominations. In the midst of changes in the culture, technology and the way education is made accessible, the NALS seeks to provide a sound theological education while meeting the needs of students and providing pastors for future generations. During one of the breakout sessions, he provided further information and answered numerous questions about the seminary and theological education.



During the business sessions Pastor Solveig Zamzow was elected to the position of Mission District Secretary, Pastor Ryan Henkel to the position of Clergy Council Member, and Elise Patzke to the position of Lay Council Member. Thanks were offered to Craig Lease, Pastor Ron Rasmussen and Chris Schlee for their service to the Mission District during the past several years.

There were 23 congregations represented. Ken and Margaret DeBower were Vilmar's delegates. Those registered who attended were 20 clergy delegates, 25 lay delegates, and 34 visitors — a total of 79, in addition to the members of Zion who hosted and provided for everyone's needs throughout the day.

- Reaching out to those who have lost someone to suicide and offering continued support of those affected by the loss of a loved one to suicide through AFSP's loss and healing programs;
- Advocating for mental health legislation at the local level through state legislative days and calls to action.
